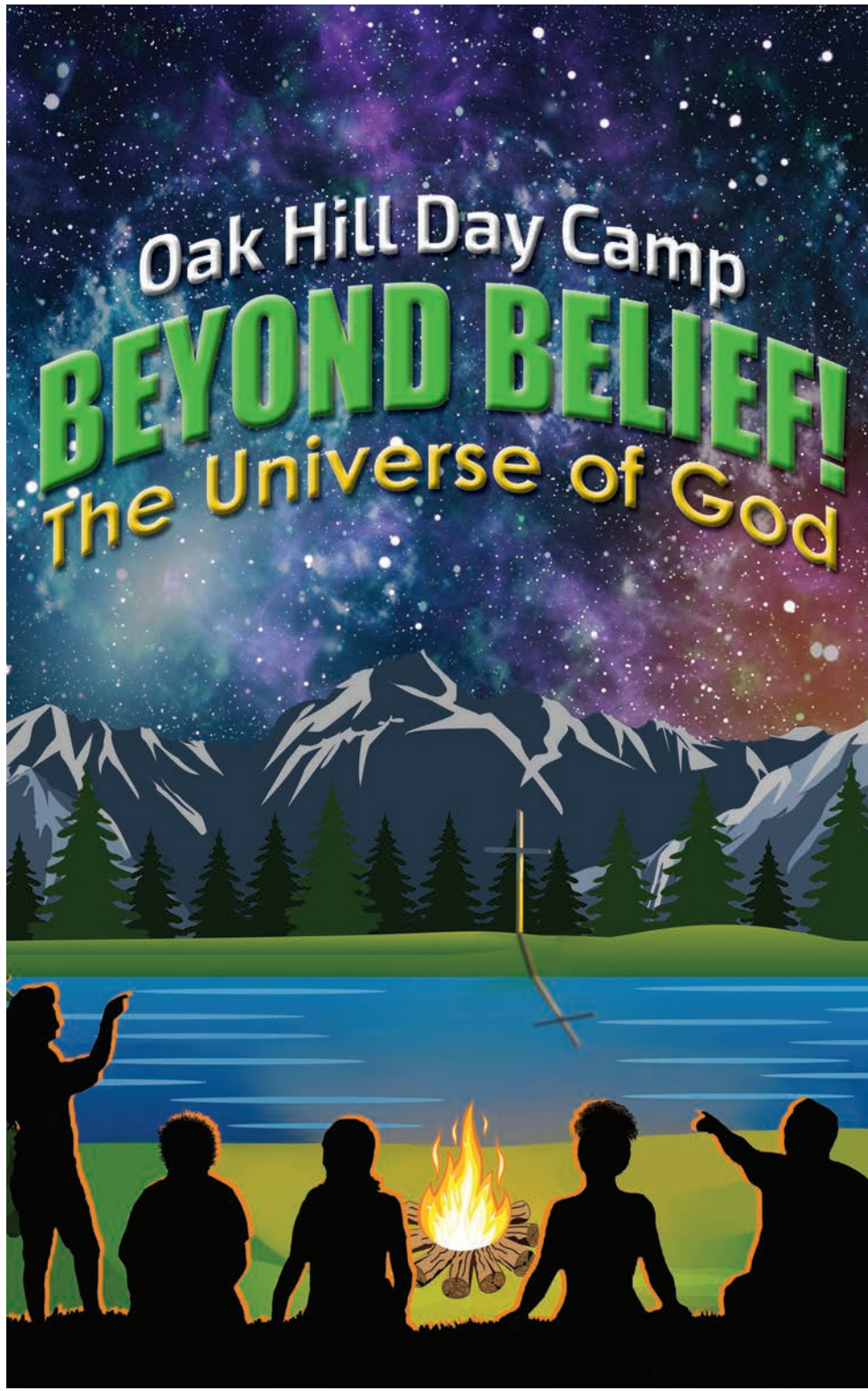

Many of our counselors are CPR/first aid certified, and all are trained to be energetic, inclusive, and encouraging. Given the structure of our Middle School Camp, we are unable to accept children that have physical, emotional, or behavioral disabilities.

Oak Hill Day Camp
Age 4-Rising 5th {June – August}

Campers will enjoy sports, archery, acting, slip 'n slide, ropes courses, swimming and more. We encourage building relationships, running across fields, laughing loudly, getting dirty and discovering something new every day.

Middle School Day Camp
Rising 6th-8th {June – August}

Campers will explore our community while still enjoying all the fun and traditions of Oak Hill Day Camp. Campers will go off campus twice a week to locations such as Adventure Works, Cumberland Caverns and Escape Nashville. We also have an on-campus overnight. There are 12 campers in each session with two counselors.

GAP Camps
{May and August}

GAP camp is offered to alleviate some of the stress of childcare in those “gaps” between summer camps and school being in session. Campers will enjoy all the fun of Oak Hill Day Camp. Parents can sign up by the day or week.

Basketball & Soccer Camps
{June}

Local coaches and college players will work with campers to improve individual and team skills. Campers will spend the first half of the day focused solely on the sport and then they will finish the day enjoying Day Camp activities.

Horse Camp
{June – August}

Horse Camp is every Friday. Gain a deeper knowledge and skill in horseback riding at Horse Camp. Campers will spend the entire day at the barn learning horsemanship and horseback riding skills. You do not have to be enrolled in Oak Hill Day Camp, but space is extremely limited.

Theatre Camp
{June}

Theatre Camp, a two-week camp, is for campers to learn songs and choreography. Campers will have the opportunity to audition for roles and perform in this year’s production as well as assist in technical aspects. Family and friends will be invited to come see the production.
